2010 Annual Trip Report

This year marked the fifth anniversary of Tanzania Life Project. We've been very fortunate to have a large number of dedicated partners in the support of our mission. We've also been blessed with a very committed team on the ground in Tanzania working through Tanzania Life Project (T), a Non-Government Organization (NGO).

Rather than make our usual trip to Dodoma, Tanzania this year, we decided it was a good time to have our partners from TLP (T), Ben Mlula and Vincent Chiwamba, come to the United States. The cost of their trip was made possible through special donations from private donors. Thus, as in all years, no TLP funds are ever used for travel either way to or from Tanzania.
